Kumamoto Prefecture Shin – Toroku Public Housing Complex



Architectural Outline

The use of a large truss frame and hollow floor panels made it possible to create bright, open, functional spaces with no beams intruding in the housing units. The corridors on the north side were detached from the building proper, facilitating ventilation and daylighting on that side. The north side of the building, which faces the street, was perceived as an important part of the townscape. A dynamic structure was therefore used to give it a distinctive form. Pleasant pedestrian spaces with unobstructed views were created at ground level. Existing cherry trees were saved, and a public sidewalk, a pilotis area underneath the building and void spaces were created. All this came about because the architects perceived an urban-development type public housing project to be not only an opportunity to provide quality housing but an investment that can help create new urban relationships.
