Arao Police Station Nagasu Police Box



Architectural Outline

To make the koban (police box) seem a more friendly place, the vestibule was made an open, glassed-in space. At the same time, expressive thick walls of brick were arranged in a rhythmical manner on the street side to provide the facility with necessary protection. The building was kept low so as to blend into the townscape in the area. A flat, circular roof has been floated above the wall at the corner facing the intersection so as to make the koban's presence known. The projecting roof provides shelter from the rain for passersby and invites people into the koban. At night, light from inside the koban is reflected off the lower surface of the roof and helps illuminate the street.
