Architectural Outline

Kahoku is surrounded by a rich natural environment. This plaza suggests a way of getting in touch with nature. The site was formerly a terraced field. Use was made of the different ground levels on the site in arranging volumes created from wooden frames. Visitors are able to experience these frames in various ways; e.g. they can peer into a frame as if it were a lens, or look up at the sky through slits between frames. The material is locally-produced "Aya" cedar. We deliberately used culled wood. We wanted the roughly finished cedar to generate diverse shadows and each wooden frame to be natural in expression.
