## Kumamoto South Police, Kumamoto Station Koban (Community Police Station)



## **Building Profile**

This facility is in a corner of the East Exit Square of Kumamoto Station and is located midway between the Tsuboigawa and Shirakawa riverfronts in the east and the rich greenery of the mountains Hanaoka-yama and Mannichi-yama in the west. With the progress of the construction plan, this area has become more vibrant. This police box has two roles: to watch over the community and to protect the safety of the many people who visit the station-front, which itself acts as a gateway to Kumamoto. Built as an expression of the interplay between water, green, and motion, this community police station is meant to become and landmark for both travelers and citizens alike.

By utilizing the characteristic round-cornered triangle land shape for the traffic square, the architecture outline was decided with consideration for police car traffic lines, approach for users, and visibility in the environment. This building was purposefully designed with no clear distinction between its front and back.

There is a wide curving balcony protruding from a robust black outer wall structure on the first floor. The sparkling white 9mm-thick steel screen which wraps around the building seems to be floating. All the inner screens and outer walls have gradational colors, while round apertures large and small are colored green as the mountains beyond, blue as water, and in warm colors evoking motion - all blending harmoniously with the surrounding views from Kumamoto Station. The colors of the sky and landscape change over the course of the day, as do those of the building when seen from different directions or distances. With these hues mingling with the architecture, the police box building provides a benevolent presence for the area and its numerous visitors.
